# WHICH LINE TO USE

The normal line runs just E of South. The East line is runs approx SE

Normally use the old club line.

Use the EAST Line if –

- A. The wind is between N and NE. Start upriver
- B. The wind is between S and SW. Start downriver

You wish to race upriver and require a turning mark ('Q') out of the worst tide off the 'Guinivere' (make sure it's not being used!) or just downriver of the ferry close to the usual line.

<u>NB</u> The Finish Line will always be the normal Club line unless there is good reason to finish on the East Line. In this case the OD must inform entrants.

Don't forget to POST the 'E' board in front of the course and write on the Entry form

### S I Notes to Officers of the Day -2011

- > Temporary Buoys: to be placed by safety boat as required
  - **Q** Quay: to be laid about 100m downstream of the line to act as a turning mark before the corner.
- ➤ Halfway: to be used as half another leg, usually to Ferry or to Pigpail, but could be Short or Long Gull.
- New Sailing Instruction (2009)

  The penalty for obstructing any 'right of way' boat or for touching a turning mark shall both be a 360 degree turn, consisting of both a tack and a gybe. (No 720s)
- Note: A Chartlet is available showing the position of buoys and a distance string on the Bridge wall opposite the door.
- **Advisors or Arbitrations** instead of Protests in some
- Competitor may elect to take a 20% exoneration penalty (min 2 places) if they didn't do a penalty on the water.
