#### **VHF RADIO PROCEDURES**

# All powerboats must carry handheld VHF radio -collect from Bridge

- Transmission in only permitted on the **Marina channels M2** (aka P4) [and **M1** (aka 37a) if reception is poor or crowded out by other users]
- Remember VHF channels are public channels and it is important that proper language and procedures are observed you never know who might be listening.
- Make sure that bridge and safety boat are **both tuned to same channel** and that safety boat team know how to use their set!
- Maintain listening watch during race/session. If Safety Boat does not answer your call try switching base station or portable to HI power (should not be necessary within river), return to LO power asap.

## **GOING AFLOAT**

- Base station at Bridge to be turned on, adjust volume and squelch [Note1]
- **Do a radio check** between bridge and all powerboats before departing pontoon [*Note* 2]
- ICOM handheld sets to be carried **attached to powerboat driver** (belt clip or lanyard). These are waterproof provided they are not dropped, or
- STAR M handheld sets to be **placed in waterproof pouches** and attached to powerboat driver

#### **CALL SIGNS**

Base station - DABCHICK Club Zodiac - OSCAR
Club Boat -ANDREN Club Boat - ROBERTS

## **COMING ASHORE**

After use the **3 ICOM handhelds** to be returned to bridge switched **OFF** and placed on the 2 chargers on top of bridge cupboard following instructions on noticeboard above it.

You should aim to have at least 3 fully operational handhelds available for use every day during training periods.

Turn off base station after session/race, but leave its mains power switched ON.

Record any problems and note number of hours of operation. Any problems should be reported to and dealt with **by Heather Patrick (01394 450120).**

Turn 'squelch' (outer ring of volume on/off control) until a hissing noise then adjust gently in opposite direction until it disappears. The same applies to portables, but they are pre-set so fiddle as little as possible. ...

When Safety Boat team collect their portable and are still within hailing distance/ashore carry out a radio check thus:

## Eg. OSCAR –THIS IS DABCHICK – DO YOU RECEIVE?-OVER

[always say OVER when expecting a reply and OUT when you're not, never 'say over and out'] Wait for Safety Boat to confirm they can hear you and say:

OSCAR THIS IS DABCHICK RECEIVING YOU LOUD AND CLEAR- DABCHICK OUT.

Use this formula when communicating with Safety boat at all times eg OSCAR, THIS IS DABCHICK, DABCHICK – OVER.

Wait for their acknowledgement and then give your message as briefly as possible, always begin with their call sign twice and identify yourself twice, eg

OSCAR, OSCAR THIS IS DABCHICK, DABCHICK-LADY FLORENCE NEAR RAYDON

MARK, BE AWARE-OVER.

The recipient must acknowledge the call before whoever has initiated it signs off with OUT.
